After having to take a couple of years off from physically traveling to Costanza to help at the Ark, this year a team was able to travel in person and offer help and support!

#### Bob Breneman shares:

This year our labor was focused on painting the basketball court walls, the walls around the entrance gate to the site and the guard house. The colors are being changed from bright yellow to nice grays.

We painted each morning and in the afternoon played games with the Ark children. The days it rained in the afternoon we played bingo with the Ark children. Two days we ate the noon meal in Ark homes with the families. We did a home visit to a 20 year old who lived in the Ark until 18 years old. We took a gift of food. She graduated from high school and is pursuing some additional schooling to be a chef. She is the example of how these children are being helped by Kids Alive.

We visited the waterfall, the statue overlooking Constanza, the baseball ministry. The school and baseball ministry are the Light in Constanza. The community around the school is growing and improving. The baseball ministry is keeping boys in school and attending church. All of the baseball coaches are young men that the baseball industry discarded with no education so they are working hard to help these boys.

#### Filling the Backpacks

USA Today recently reported that the average school supply cost per child was \$661.00 a year. Additionally, it was also reported that more than half of the parents surveyed indicated that they could not afford the needed school supplies. The NCES, National Center for Education Statistics reported that 83% of the public schools "experienced procurement challenges".

Through the program "Filling the Backpacks" started in 2018, Rio Community schools have generously been providing all needed supplies to all students through generous community donations. Backpacks are also provided to any child in need.

While it is such a wonderful blessing for families to know this is one area that will not be a financial burden to them, it is also a much needed savings for teachers in the district. In addition to filling the backpacks, additional classroom supplies such as kleenex, disinfectant wipes, dry erase markers, and other classroom necessities are also able to be provided.

NCES reports that 90% of the teachers spend their own money on supplies that the students need, with the average teacher spending \$500 per school year. Sarinity Pendleton, 2018 Rio High School graduate and my daughter, just completed her first year of teaching in the La Crosse school district. This was a topic that we discussed often as she, like many teachers, had shortfalls of needed classroom supplies.
